The Championship would make their recommendation to the House of Delegates tomorrow before the voting. The presentations would only be given once & questions fielded tonight only! The award will be given to the site with the majority vote.

### Redesign of Championship Medal

Mel presented a design for a new championship medal. It was the general feeling of the group that a new medal was needed.

It was moved that we accept the design & solicit bids for the best price.

A metal type of either relief or a combination of relief & cloisonne was preferred.
